6.1 <u>Program Revision: Certificate in Early Childhood Education</u> K. Gronsdahl spoke to the item.

The proposed revision adds a new course, ECED 2365, Global Perspectives in Early Childhood Education, as a companion course to ECED 2361, Indigenous World View. The addition of ECED 2365 as an alternative to ECED 2361, will ensure that students are not held back in completing their ECE program due to challenges in securing Indigenous instructors for ECED 2361.
