M: Course Objectives / Learning Outcomes

The student will be expected to demonstrate proficiency in Japanese in all tenses, at the basic level in:

- 1. Aural comprehension of simple discourse.
- 2. Reading comprehension of simplified texts, written in Japanese (hiragana, katakana, and 100 kanji).
- 3. Speech delivery: cope with everyday situations, tell stories in both past and present tenses, express feelings.
- 4. Written expression: simple guided paragraphs using hiragana, katakana and 100 kanji.
- 5. Understanding and appreciating differences and similarities in culture.

N: Course Content:

Systematic introduction of:

- 1. Basic syntactic structures
- 2. Basic lexicon
- 3. Elements of kanji
- 4. The phonological system of Japanese
- 5. Some aspects of the Japanese culture through the text and additional material presented.
- 6. Incorporation of 1-5 through a bilingual program on campus with peers from Japan.

O: Methods of Instruction

The functional, communicative approach is used.

Classroom activities include presentation of material by the instructor, practice in pairs and small groups, listening comprehension and audio-visual presentations.

Review labs in small groups with a Native Language Assistant.
